

Sino-Malaysian trade boost

The MALAYSIA — Guangdong Chamber of Investment Promotion (MGCIP), Malaysia — China Chamber of Commerce (Maycham — Guangdong) and China Council for the Promotion of International Trade (CCPIT — Guangdong) will be jointly organising the 4th Guangdong — Malaysia Bilateral Enterprise Business Council Meeting on Nov 22 in Guangdong, China. The meeting will be officiated by Tan Sri Ong Ka Ting, the Prime Minister's special envoy to China.

The meeting aims to provide a networking platform to the Malaysian and Chinese entrepreneurs as well as to get insight into investment opportunities. This makes Malaysia the right choice for the investors from China. The Malaysia My Second Home Programme introduced by the Malaysian government enables foreign investors to stay in Malaysia for up to 10 years is added value for the foreign investors.

Datuk Beh Hang Kong, the chairman of the organising committee for the event, encourages Malaysian entrepreneurs to take part. Registration will be closed on Nov 15. Although participation is free, flights and accommodations will be the responsibility of the attendees.
